7. CEO Update

Mr. Pentz covered the follow items:

5-Year Strategic Plan Presentation

Mr. Pentz presented the 5-year strategic plan that was near completion with Transpro. He provided reasoning and justification regarding why NTD commissioned the strategic planning project. After extensive teamwork and brainstorming, NTD's newly defined mission is "Moving Southwest Connecticut Forward" with a newly defined vision of "Advancing the Community through Caring, Commitment and Connections".

NTD's newly defined organizational values are: Respect, Professionalism, Collaboration, Intentionality, Supportive, Motivating, Appreciative, Trust, Safety.

NTD's success outcomes have been defined as: *Customer Satisfaction, Employee Engagement, Community Value and Ridership.*

The management team is identifying what work needs to be done, and will monitor and assign ownership of each success outcome area.

Commissioner McQuaid asked if this was for internal purposes or if it would be public facing.

Mr. Pentz explained that it would be managed internally but updates will be reported quarterly and made available to the public.

An overview of the new performance scorecard was provided with an explanation of the weighting factors for each success outcome.

NTD New Network Implementation

On August 11th NTD will be launching a much-anticipated new bus network. Mr. Pentz emphasized the amount of work that went into this and the heavy lift that remained for converting to a streamlined, more simplified network with greater frequency on Norwalk's main corridors. He provided an overview of each new route and mentioned a press event was scheduled for August 11th at 11:30am at the SoNo Station. He stated NTD's intent was to roll out fare free to help riders adapt to the new routes. It was noted that as part of the change, Burnell Blvd will be converted to two-way traffic.

Facility Renovation Update:

Mr. Pentz stated the facility Renovation project has now exceeded two-years in length. He shared that NTD staff expressed concern that they do not foresee the project being completed within the calendar year. The latest substantial completion date provided by the contractor was October 8th, which the shop manager felt was grossly unrealistic.

Miscellaneous Items:

Mr. Pentz stated that NTD was holding off on awarding the electrification charging study to Wendell, the next phase of bus electrification for the facility. Mr. Pentz expressed that the NTD leadership team has lost confidence in the existing contractor, and that too much of the management and oversight burden of the renovation has fallen on NTD. The district does not feel adequately supported by current partners, so they will be revisiting next steps in pursuit of a more efficient, effective and transparent outcome towards electrification.
